Annual Performance Plan (APP) 2023-2024

Crime Reduction

- 10% increase in Prolific Offender Checks
 - 146 have been completed resulting in breach charges
- 10% increase in Hot Spot Patrols
 - Total number of patrols 867 resulting in an increase of occurrences in Leduc “hot spots”
- Increase use of Bait Equipment (Goal of 6)
 - 1 has been completed

During this quarter, we have seen an increase in both hot spots and offender checks. LCRU conducted one warrant round up and deployed one bait vehicle.

Annual Performance Plan (APP) 2023-2024

Enhance Road Safety

- Increase number of JFO's with Leduc CPOs
 - 2 completed

This Quarter, two operations focusing on impaired driving were conducted on Hwy 39 – 50 Street in Calmar.

- One Operation was conducted with the Alberta Sheriffs
- Second Operation was completed by Leduc Detachment general duty members.

Enhanced Community Confidence & Engagement

- Increase attendance at Pro-Active events
 - 18 have been completed
- Attendance at Youth Engagements – 9 completed
- Increase of School Presentations
 - 5 have been completed including informing the role of an School Resource Officer (SRO) in the schools
- Crime Prevention Presentations
 - 3 completed

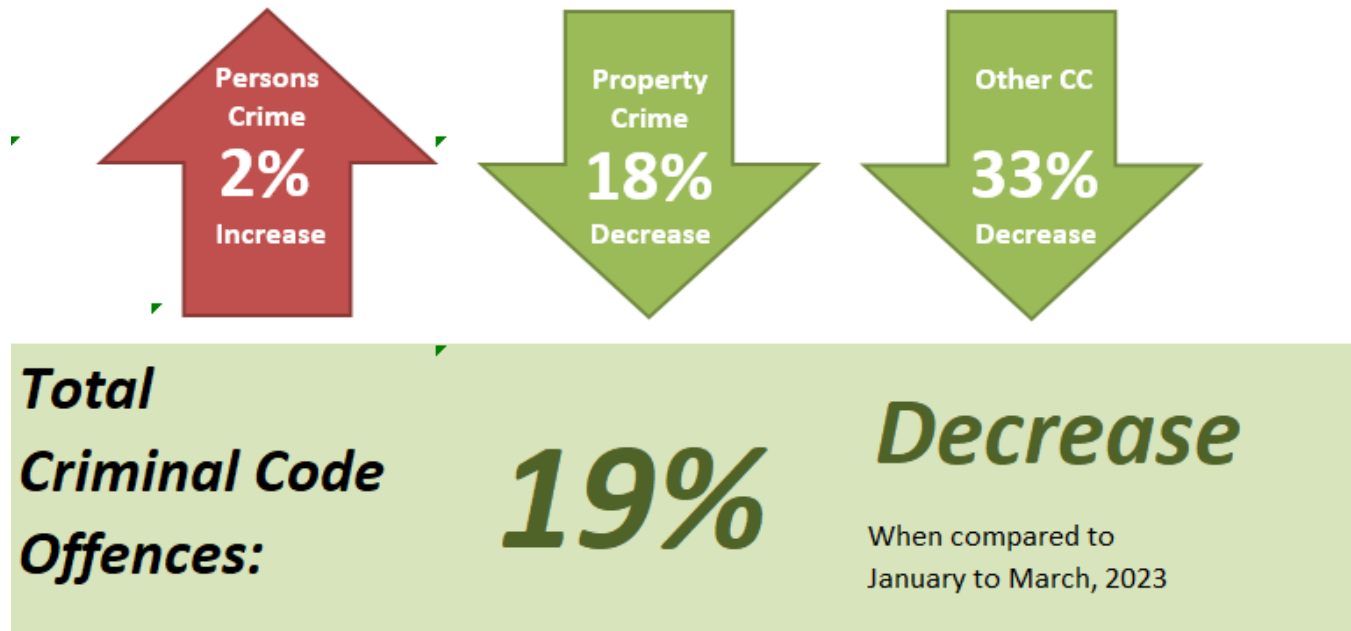

Leduc Municipal Crime Gauge

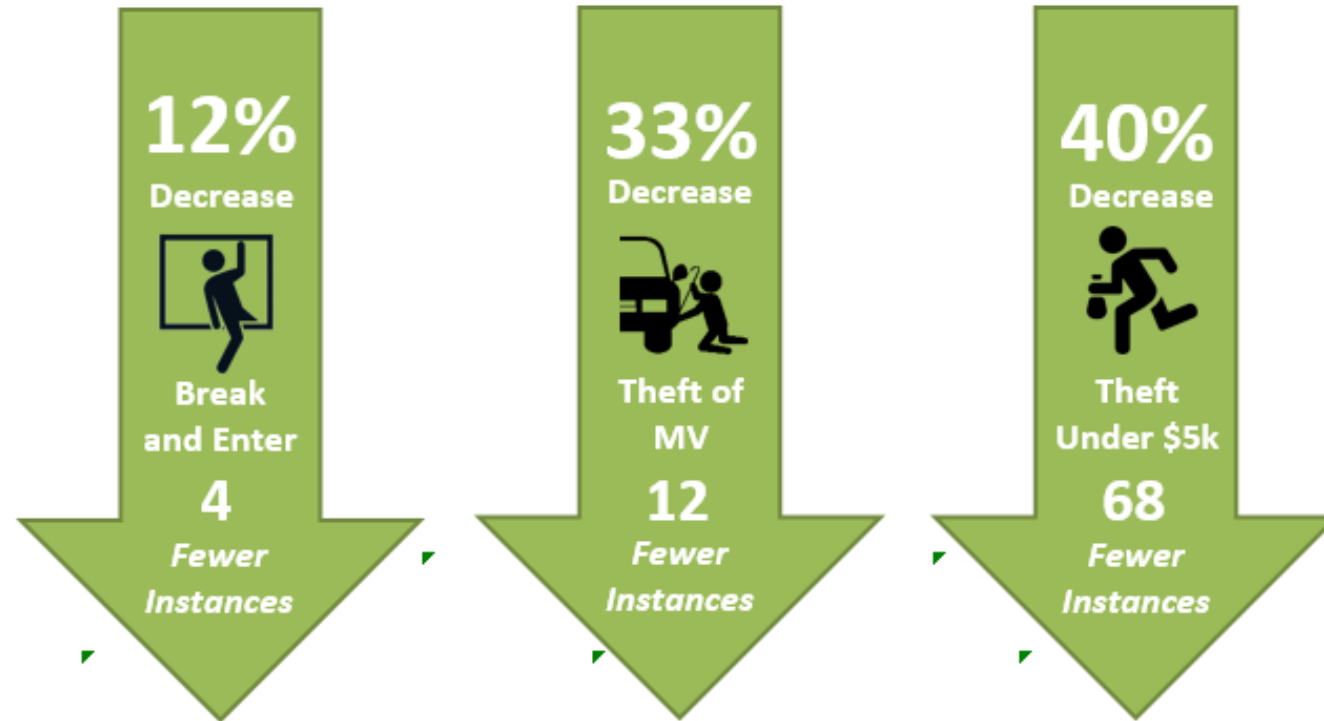
2024 vs. 2023



Leduc Police and Crisis Team (LPACT)

Mandate

- Leduc Police and Crisis Team [LPACT] will serve the community within the city of Leduc by addressing mental health concerns. LPACT will respond to calls of service where clients are struggling with their mental health. LPACT will assist, when requested, by general duty service members at an unrelated call for service if a mental health concern of a client arises.
- LPACT provides on scene assessment, support, de-escalation, and response to clients. LPACT will also provide follow-up and pro-active consultation to prevent further calls for service.
- Involvement of LPACT will also reduce unnecessary burden on the hospital emergency departments, reduce out of service time for general duty officers, and divergence of vulnerable clients away from the Criminal Justice System. Through the position of LPACT, the ultimate goal is strengthening the overall health of citizens in the Leduc community.



LPACT Continued

LPACT Contact with Clients

- De-escalated a youth in crisis off the roof of a house, assisted the family and youth in accessing psychology services, medication assessments, and community resources for the youth's mental health struggles
- LPACT responded to a retired Military client who had a SKS rifle during a mental health crisis. LPACT Officer assisted them and the client is now attending therapy, on new medication, and thanked LPACT for their assistance

Emails LPACT received from the Community

- “Wish to thank you for your concern, time and resources offered. [...] I will encompass your new ideas to my wellness, mindfulness and self care plan to reduce my spontaneous acts of self harm”
- “Thank you for your service. Plus, thank you for stopping in this morning. I am relieved and very encouraged by your visits”



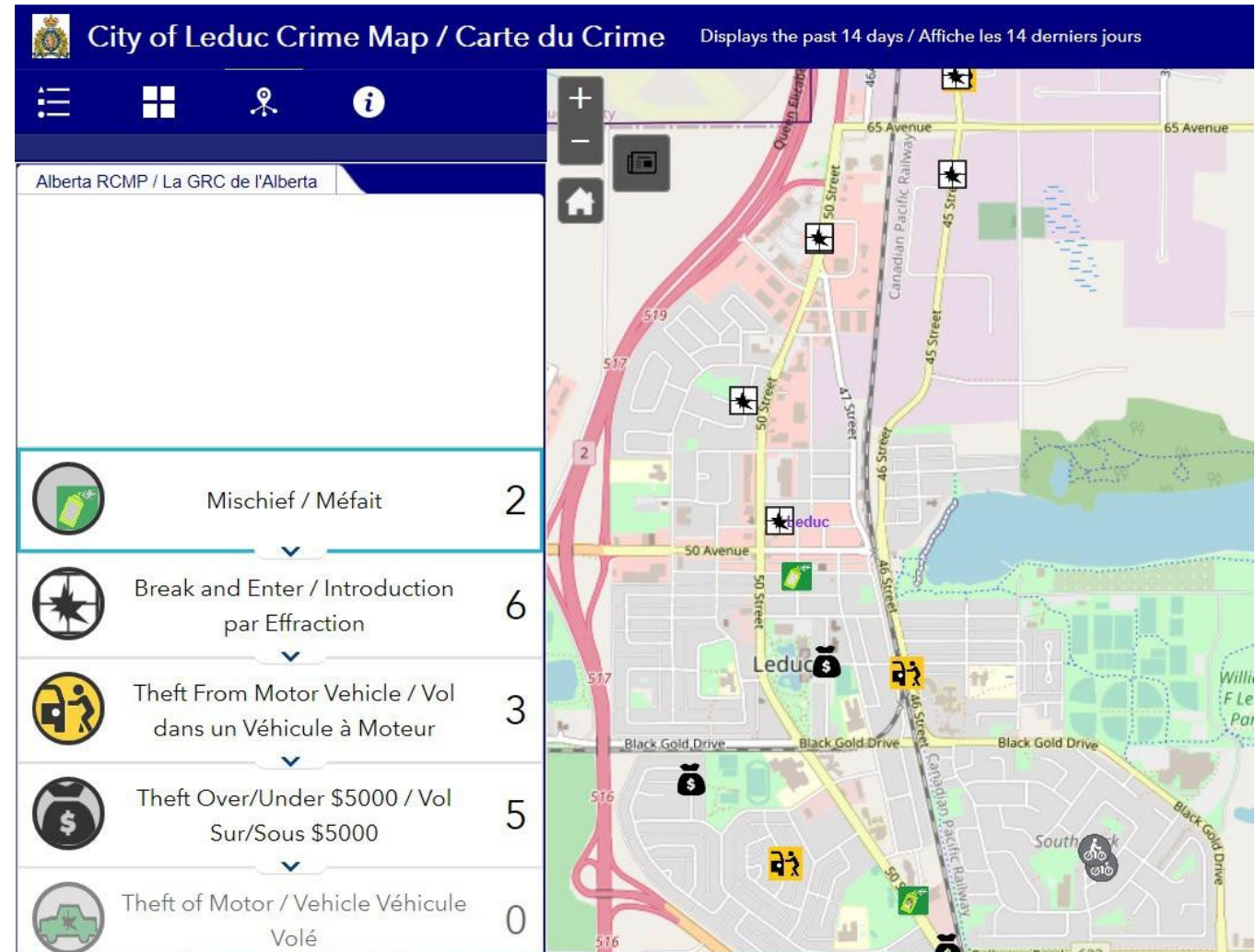
Downtown

1. Short term mitigation strategy using Overtime to fund an RCMP officer as well as a CPO. They will work various shifts with a zero tolerance approach.
2. Downtown has been added to the Priorities of the Crime Reduction Unit.
3. We have returned to mandatory patrols for a minimum of 30 minutes. All business lines at the Detachment will be engaged including CPO's.

- › The more intelligence we can gather, the more effective we can be in the community

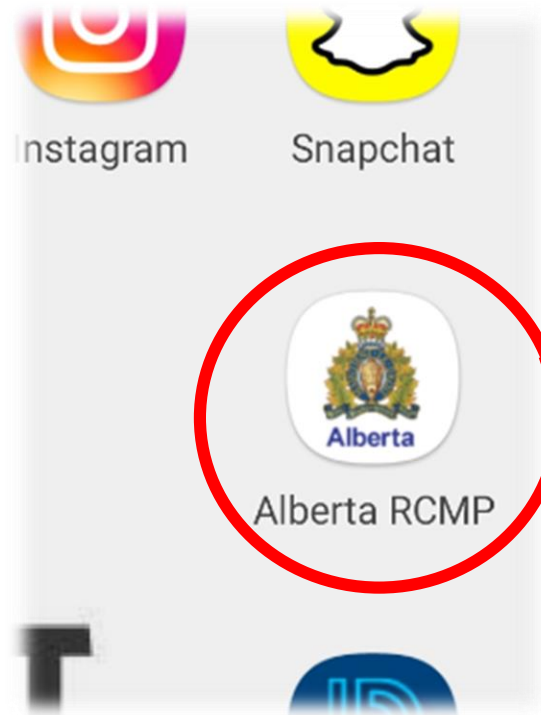

RAVE Alert mass notification system used to share information with Albertans

- to inform public of alerts (wildfire evacuations etc.), bolo's, crime prevention tips and proactive police activities
- Alerts may be sent via email, text message or phone call

Once signed up and logged into the online system, individuals will be able to choose which areas of the province they would like to receive notifications for. Alternatively, they can choose to receive updates from across the entire province. Notifications will then be sent via text, voicemail, or email, based on the user's set preferences. All user information is confidential.
