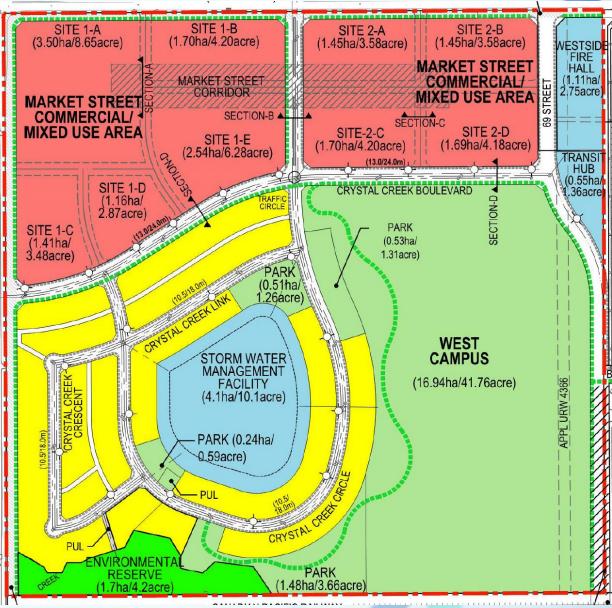

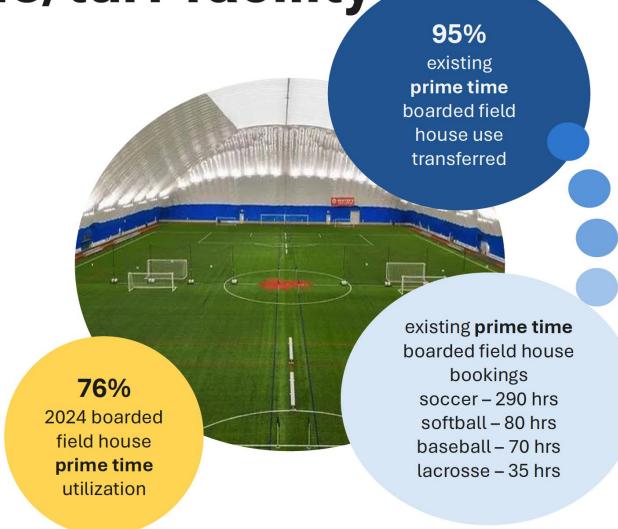

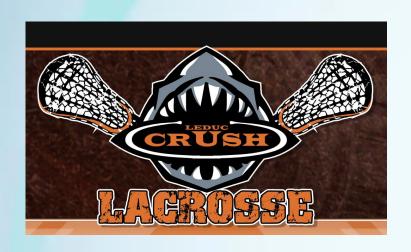
LRC impacts of new dome/turf facility

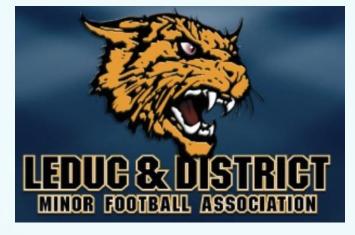

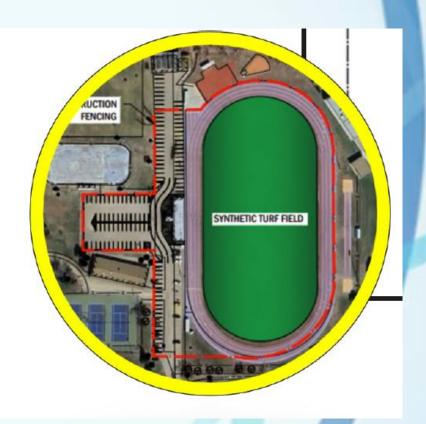
