


Question 1: Are you a resident of the City of Leduc?




The survey received a total of 5,560 responses. Of those:

- 4,199 indicated they were residents of the City of Leduc
- 112 indicated they were not residents of the City of Leduc
- 1,249 indicated they were not Leduc residents, but did visit the city frequently for work, shopping or other activities.



Question 2: Are you in favour of face masks being made mandatory in the City of Leduc?




Responses to survey questions have been broken out to identify **total responses received** (in red) and responses from those who identified as **residents of Leduc** (in blue).

Of the 4,199 Leduc residents who completed the survey, when asked whether they were in favour of face masks being made mandatory in the City of Leduc, 2,039 residents (49%) indicated they were in favour, while 2,159 (51%) said they were opposed to mandatory masking.

One resident who completed a paper survey indicated they had mixed feelings about mandatory masking, and so they could not answer either 'Yes' or 'No' to this question.



Question 3: If face masks become mandatory in the City of Leduc, where should they be required to be worn?



When asked to select all the areas in the City of Leduc that face masks should be required if they were to be made mandatory, the survey results show:

- 3,566 residents support masks being mandatory on Leduc Transit vehicles and in bus shelters
- 2,471 residents support masks being mandatory inside City of Leduc facilities
- 2,030 residents support masks being mandatory inside private businesses within the city
- 712 residents support masks being mandatory at all City of Leduc outdoor public spaces

*Other comments received from respondents to this question stated that:

- masks should not be made mandatory (597 respondents)
- masks should be mandatory inside schools and churches (128 respondents)
- masks should be mandatory inside medical offices, hospitals and long-term care facilities (68 respondents)









Question 4: If you are in favour of face masks being made mandatory, why?



Residents who were in favour of face masks being made mandatory, indicated that they felt this way because:

- face masks have been shown to reduce the spread of COVID-19 (1,748 residents)
- face masks protect others who are especially vulnerable to COVID-19 (1,953 residents)
- face masks are most effective when everyone wears them (1,901 residents)
- face masks keep everyone safe (1,548 residents)
- face masks can stop infected individuals who are not displaying any symptoms of COVID-19 from unintentionally infecting others (1,868 residents)

*Other comments received from respondents to this question indicated support for mandatory masking because:

- people are not taking the COVID-19 pandemic seriously (6 respondents)
- masks have been made mandatory in neighbouring municipalities within the Edmonton Metro Region (5 respondents)



Question 5: If you are not in favour of face masks being made mandatory, why not?



Residents who were not in favour of face masks being made mandatory, indicated that they felt this way because:

- it should be their choice whether or not to wear a mask (1,586 residents)
- wearing face masks can create other issues for people with disabilities (1,362 residents)
- wearing face masks can be difficult for those who have breathing issues (1,334 residents)
- face masks are not clearly proven to offer protection from the spread of COVID-19 (1,447 residents)

*Other comments received from respondents to this question indicated that people do not support mandatory masking because:

- many people wear masks improperly, rendering them ineffective (41 respondents)
- masks create health issues (37 respondents)
- there are not enough cases in Leduc yet to warrant mandatory masking (31 respondents)

 masks create a false sense of security and people become careless with other health and hygiene measures (11 respondents)
