

- City of Leduc


Yard waste only:

- City of Leduc yard waste station




Why Organics?

Potential for 20,000 to 30,000 tonnes organics per year.

Contamination Issue

Winter 2019:

- Declined entry to Stickland Farms
- Organics on transfer floor, screen loads, loads over 5% landfilled

Spring/Summer 2020:

- Loads landfilled from Beaumont, Devon and City of Leduc
- Yard waste clean and stockpiled
- Working with Stickland to gain re-entry

Fall 2020:

First load re-accepted by Stickland, mostly yard waste

Yard Waste August 14, 2020



Stockpiled yard waste is clean.



Ten loads from Aug. 10, 13, 14. All loads are contaminated.

Processing Options

Short –term:

- No other viable options for alternate locations to take contaminated organics
- Application to compost on site submitted to Alberta Environment
- Other technologies e.g. worm castings

Longer – term:

- Reviewing proposal from GFL for on-site facility
- Continued regional collaboration

Key Messages

- Many residents sort correctly but contamination levels have increased to a point that some loads cannot be composted and must be landfilled.
- Throwing non-compostable material such as plastic bags and general
 waste in your organics cart can contaminate a whole truck load of
 organics resulting in it all being landfilled. One or two people can spoil
 the efforts of many.
- Action must be taken now to address this or costs will increase.
- Residents will be informed of any specific compliance issues through an information tag left on their cart, and contaminated carts will not be collected

Next Steps – City of Leduc

2020:

- Continued education and awareness
- Increased inspections and stickering within existing budgets
- Pilot cameras on trucks, notices to residents

2021:

- Implement LDRWMA shared education tools: utility insert, ads, etc.
- Letter from Mayor to residents

2022:

- Assess effectiveness of LDRWMA shared program, determine scope of continued services
- Education and marketing will be required on an ongoing basis
