Administration presented 5 options. Council directed Administration
to go with Option 2, which is to take out two hoops on the West half of
the court and revisit after a year. Administration was directed to look
at the Land Use Bylaw relative to placement of basketball courts
relative to residences and to ensure amenities are in prior to
neighborhoods being developed - \$23K.

Capital - Community Garden

 The Telford Lake Community Garden is sold out each year; however, 30 plots are also abandoned each year. Three options for build-out were presented. Council agreed with Administration's recommendation of a trial site on the west end of Leduc with smaller plots, requiring reduced capital \$166K.

Business Case: Heritage Coordinator

 Dedicated support for heritage organizations. Council is in support of a permanent position - \$7.5K one time cost; \$87,496 annual ongoing cost.
